





My Passion for the Prisoner

few years ago, I was part of a group called Project 180 composed of ex-felons who visited the Torres unit in Hondo, Texas. We had all served time at Torres, and we wanted to share our experiences with our former friends with whom we had served time. It was a bit strange returning to the unit at which I had served 15 of my 18 years, but within minutes the nervousness dissipated, and I spoke about one of my favorite topics, the victim mentality. The article that was posted on the WSD website summarized my talk as follows:

Ruben Constante was the next presenter. With a practiced cadence and a flair for public speaking, he addressed the dangers of a "victim mentality," speaking to students about family and examining attitudes.

"The victim mentality is the most toxic, self-defeating, destructive mentality you can have," he said. "It does three things. First, it disempowers you. When you blame someone else, you forfeit power. Oftentimes, in our humanity, we do things to try to compensate for what was 'taken' from us. Secondly, it incapacitates you and makes you feel unable to do anything about your situation. Lastly, it embitters you. You start hating people. You're angry all the time. You're mad because you got a set-off, didn't get a letter, or didn't get commissary money. You feel the whole world is conspiring against your existence. The truth is the world doesn't care about your existence; you have to care about your existence. People are not out to get you," he said.

"The biggest thing you're gonna fight is your attitude," he said. "The difference between a good day and a bad day is your attitude."

Upon release, Constante set out to write the books from notes scribbled in a journal during his prison tenure. At the time his Project 180° presentation at Torres, Constante had written and published three books, started a nonprofit organization and began a ministry, "pouring himself" into those who are still incarcerated.

is the June 2021 issue of Blueprints for Living Ministries, open to the page that says, "Truth does not mind being questioned. A lie does not like being challenged." These words have given me the courage to speak up on issues both theologically, as well as every other area in my life.

In a world that has lost its way from the truths of Scripture, I am glad that through the DMP I was able to get a better grasp on my role as a godly man. Learning that it is no longer about seeking my own pleasure, but it is about seeking that which pleases the Lord. The DMP has helped me see through the lies that the modern evangelical church is trying to push as truth. The Word of God calls us to be "holy". Learning who we are, and Who created us, enables us to be the true light that we were meant to be. Obedience and submission are necessary for healthy spiritual growth.

Overall, I am grateful for Ruben, and the DMP. Not only had his program helped me live a more peaceful life while on the inside, but now that I am on the outside, I am able to hold onto what he helped me learn. The most important thing I learned through the DMP is how to be a disciple of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through building my relationship with God, my relationship with myself, and my relationships with others, I live a fuller life than I thought possible.


I have not been in this earth for that long, only 22 short years, but I have been here long enough to experience and witness some horrific things from humanity that would make you lose hope.


Take my own life for example; born from a single mother that was addicted to drugs, although she tried her best to provide for myself and my other four siblings, life's circumstances were not the best by a long shot. After she passed away suddenly from a heart attack when I was six, a series of unfortunate events took place leaving us in a shelter and eventually in a home where we were constantly being emotionally, verbally, and even physically abused.

Nevertheless, I refused to be oppressed and let my situation get the best of me. In search of an outlet, I found slivers of hope in any place I could, whether it be sports, academics, or even surrounding myself with lots of friends. Eventually though, even that false reality came crumbling down on me after being evicted my junior year of high school.

Having no place to go and no one to call on for help left me with this unshakeable feeling of hopelessness that no amount of momentary success, validation, or satisfaction could give me. I vividly remember breaking down in the middle of class one day, so fed up with the stress I was under that I couldn't even function. I was at such a low place in my life that I had nowhere else to look but up.

I realize now that God had orchestrated this all for a reason. I'm not saying that God absolutely wanted certain things to happen to me or that He thought they were good. Like everyone else in the





world, I have experienced things in life (at the hand of others or just in general) that are unexplainable or cannot be excused. However, what I will say is that in 2017 I received a revelation of a hope that would last me a lifetime—and even after that.

This is a hope that surpasses anything that the world could have possibly given me and, until this day it rocks, my world just to think about it. This hope is not something that I had to pay for, nor did I have to be a special member of some secret group to receive it.

The burning question: *How* exactly did I receive this hope (especially after all that I had experienced and who I had become)? Well, first I had to realize I was in dire need or help not just within my circumstances but in my heart. Life had chewed me up like a ragdoll and spit me out, leaving me with nowhere to run and no way to make sense of what I was experiencing.





Five Essential Disciplines of the Faith: 3. Worship, part 1. Adrian Pasillas

He was essentially the primary minister of a very, very large congregation, and the father of two sons. It is one thing for a son to follow in the vocational footsteps of his dad, but to have two sons desirous to be in the ministry? He was effectively bursting with pride as he was going to ordain his own sons into the priestly fold. They were, as expected, to be ambitious and absolutely punctilious, as required by God through Moses, in the subsequent performance of their priestly duties...just like their "old man"... so much so that they, one day, thought they could harmlessly tweak the worship service; to add something new, something "exciting" (sounds familiar?). "What's it gonna hurt? Who's gonna know?", they probably rationalized. Unfortunately, their cavalier attitude towards the codified worship rules laid down by God earned them a quick and unexpected fiery demise, as depicted in Leviticus 10:1-3:

Now Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it and laid incense on it and offered unauthorized fire before the LORD, which he had not commanded them. And fire came out from before the LORD and consumed them, and they died before the LORD. Then Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the LORD has said: 'Among those who are near me I will be sanctified, and before the people I will be glorified." And Aaron held his peace. (ESV)

The holiness of God was in display in ancient Israel as He makes yet again an unforgettable point: worship of the living God is serious business...and, for us believers, it's still is.

There is something we need to be bulletized about when it comes to our culture. It is indeed manifest in the American DNA

Five Hard Truths That Changed My Mindset Joel Malm

Eight years ago, I was dealing with some major disappointment and frustration about life.

A guy recommended I hire a really expensive coach to help me. I was hesitant because, honestly, I thought, What could he possibly know that I don't already know?

My friend told me, "Do one session. Do everything he says. If something good doesn't come of it, don't do it anymore."

That first session the coach told me, "The only thing holding you back right now is your mindset."

I thought that was ridiculous. Among other things, lack of money and connections were holding me back. But over the next few weeks I started to unpack how I saw the world. I realized I had some bad mindsets.

That was when things started to change.

I was thinking back to some of the cold, hard truths I had to tell myself during that season. Here's what I landed on:

- 1. Whenever I don't like something about my life, I have to assume I am the problem not the world. I assume there is something I don't understand about myself or how people work, then start reading, praying, and asking questions. Seek out advice, then shut up and listen to what people say. Don't make excuses for why my situation is special. It's not. Assume they know something I don't about the world and how it works.
- 2. I am not special and no one is going to "discover" how special I am and launch me to success. The cavalry isn't coming to save me. I have what I need right now to build what I need right now. Big success builds on small success. But I must build and stop waiting for some magic moment or person to propel me forward. God will honor work that starts small and builds slowly.

that we have, more so now than ever, little respect for sovereignty (and it shows with the Harry/Meghan debacle). Such things as "paying homage" or "proper court etiquette" we give double blank stares, particularly when it involves our King.

In Spirit and in Truth

...is what Jesus said to the woman at the well in Sychar in John 4. He was obviously drawing a distinction between *true* and *false* worship. The woman was concerned about *where* to worship, but Jesus said God is omnipresent, and can be worshipped anywhere. But the overarching point was that people show up *physically* but not *spiritually*, if at all. Jesus also said that God is pleased with hearts fully engaged with sincere, heartfelt worship; worship that is offered in *truth*.

Truth nowadays has effectively been "ratholed" in favor for the ephemeral "feel good" of the fleeting fellowship and emotional experience. "I am...the truth..." (see John 14:6). The God of truth is most fully revealed in Jesus. God wants minds and hearts fully engaged, informed of who He is by his Word. It is an unbelievable privilege to come into His presence—to come near to Him. That's why we worship. It's the first consequence of our faith, according to Romans 5:1-2: "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through Him we also have obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God."

Now every Christian is allowed to come into God's very presence. No wall of separation, no hand selected priests and select times of the year, no elaborate ritual cleansing. We now can come *boldly* into His presence. But coming *boldly* is not coming *arrogantly* (recall Aaron's sons). We must remember that we must regard Him as holy, which was quite opposite of the attitude of the generation of the day, as depicted by sacred scripture: "... This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me..." (see Matt. 15:8-9). Worship can't be just from our lips...it's got to be from the *heart*.
